Did you know?

In conjunction with refuge staff, in a typical year the Friends present nature education and interpretive programs to more than 2,000 students, scouts, and visitors from area schools and organizations at the Oak Savanna Learning Center.

Events such as the Spring Celebration, Wildlife Festival, bird and wildflower tours, sandhill crane tours, and photography programs draw thousands of visitors of all ages to Sherburne National Wildlife Refuge every year.

Interpretive signs funded by the Friends enhance the visitor experience on refuge trails and the Prairie's Edge Wildlife Drive.



LEAVE THE ROADS; TAKE THE TRAILS

With 80% of Americans living in large metro regions and becoming increasingly disconnected from nature, the Friends of Sherburne National Wildlife Refuge are committed to expanding horizons and possibilities, not just for youth, but for people of all ages.

In 2016, thanks to federal funding and the generosity of 250 donors to the Be Wild Campaign, the Oak Savanna Learning Center opened, marking a new era for nature education in Central Minnesota. The space, furnished and landscaped through the Be Wild Campaign, continues to be used for school field trips and conservation-related community events.

CONNECTING WITHOUT WALLS

The Oak Savanna Learning Center was always imagined as the first step in a larger vision at Sherburne National Wildlife Refuge. The next phase in making wildlife and their habitats a part of our lives is the addition of an outdoor amphitheater. The amphitheater, designed to seat at least 100, will make it possible for thousands of visitors to the refuge each year to learn, connect and grow their knowledge of and appreciation for the wildlife and habitats that make the refuge special.

There is no more urgent time than now for our youth and adults alike to understand our delicate ecosystem and the role we all must play in its conservation.
